





ith the cancellation of the in-person attendee option over the past two years due to COVID, this year we plan to recognize the following award recipients at two separate events. Read below for more details on each of these distinguished honorees. We look forward to seeing you there!

2020 Georgia OBGyn Society Distinguished Service Award

Jettrey H. Korotkin, MD



Dr. Jeff Korotkin is the co-founder of Georgia Perinatal Consultants in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Korotkin graduated from Tulane University

and Miami University, where he received his medical degree. He went on to complete his internship and residency in OBGyn at Emory University. Later, he Medical Director of Ultrasonography which served to launch his career in Maternal-Fetal Medicine. Dr. Korotkin was a highly sought after expert on the topic of Maternal-Fetal Medicine and high-risk pregnancies. He lectured worldwide on a variety of perinatal topics. Dr. Korotkin lent his expertise to many organizations, committees, and hospitals, including his roles as Chief of Gynecology-Obstetric Service at Crawford W. Long Memorial Hospital (Emory Midtown), Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Northside Hospital, and Associate Professor at Emory University.

Dr. Korotkin served as President of the Georgia OBGyn Society from 1998-1999. Retirement certainly did not mean slowing down for Dr. Korotkin. He currently serves on the Georgia Maternal Mortality Review Committee (GA MMRC) which was formed to identify pregnancy-associated deaths (deaths during or within a year of pregnancy), review those caused by pregnancy complications and other selected deaths, and identify problems contributing to these deaths and interventions that may reduce these deaths. Findings from these reports are used by the Georgia legislature to set policy such as the recent HB338 which will extend postpartum Medicaid coverage for a full year following birth. Dr. Korotkin can also be found at the state capitol lending his expertise to legislators on items such as pelvic exams and the important working relationship of nurse midwives. Dr. Korotkin's passion for his career and his unique ability to successfully navigate political waters have made Georgia a better environment for women and their obstetric and gynecologic care.

The late Dr. David Byck Dr. David Boley Byck, Past-President, Georgia Obstetrical and Gynecological Society (2011-2012) passed

away November 19, 2020 at the age of 60 at his home in Savannah, GA. He is survived by his wife of 34 years Dr. Peggy Lee Byck; three daughters, Amanda Jones (Powell), Jessica Hensley (Trent), & Elle Byck; grandsons, Clark Jones & David Hensley; granddaughter, Harper Hensley; mother, Ellen R. Byck; brother, Edwin Byck (Melinda); sister, Nancy Burton; along with several nephews.

David was born in Savannah on May 14, 1960. He graduated from the Savannah Country Day School in 1978. He then attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the home of his beloved Tar Heels. David attended medical school in Augusta, Ga at the Medical School of Georgia. It is here that he met Peggy, and they married in 1986. After David and Peggy completed their residencies, they moved to Savannah and began practicing medicine at Memorial Health University Medical Center.

Dr. Byck would practice at Memorial for over 30 years and establish his legacy as an advocate for women's reproductive rights and medical education. He held many positions at Memorial Health, including Chief of Staff, Chairman of the Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology, and the Director of the Obstetrics & Gynecology residency program. He also served as a professor at the Mercer University School of Medicine. Many times, during his career, David was recognized by his peers for his leadership, including serving as Charmain of the GOGS Annual Meeting Planning Committee. He was a tireless advocate at the state level for women's reproductive rights and investing in ongoing medical education programs. He was a beloved leader, partner, physician and mentor to many and there is not a person whose life he touched who is not better for knowing him. He held everyone to a higher standard and did it all with kindness and humility.

Barbara R. Henley, MD, FACOG Clinical Sessions I, IV

Luella Klein Lectureship Series

Dr. Henley will be presenting the 2nd annual Luella Klein Lectureship on behalf of the Georgia Obstetrical and Gynecological

Foundation. Dr. Barbara Henley is a much deserved recipient of the Luella Klein Lectureship. Dr. Barbara Henley is a much deserved recipient of the Luella Klein Lectureship. Dr. Henley currently serves as an Associate Professor and Chief of Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery. She received her undergraduate degree from Princeton University in Molecular Biology with a minor in African American Studies in 1997, where she was in the U.S. Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps and honored as the Distinguished Military Graduate. Dr. Henley completed her medical degree at the University of Maryland School of Medicine in 2005. She then went on to complete her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Pennsylvania Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and subspecialty fellowship in Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

In her first lecture, "The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly: Pelvic Mesh for Incontinence and Prolapse in Women" Dr. Henley will guide attendees through the history of mesh used in treatment of female pelvic floor disorders as well as review the federal regulations on mesh usage for treatment of female pelvic floor disorders. Attendees will learn the technical differences between transabdominal vs. transvaginal mesh for treatment of prolapse, understand the risks and benefits of mesh, and review current usage of mesh for treatment of incontinence and prolapse.

Dr. Henley's lecture "Updates in Overactive Bladder Treatment" will grant attendees a review of pathophysiology of OAB. Attendees will learn to understand the risks and benefits of anticholinergic medications vs. beta agonists for treatment and will review 3rd tier treatment options including percutaneous tibial nerve stimulation, intravesical Botox, and sacroneural stimulation.

University in Cleveland, OH in 1955. After residency, she was
elected a US Senior Fulbright Scholar and studied at the

In 1986, Dr. Klein became the very first female department Chair at Emory School of Medicine and she would later hold the title of Charles Howard Candler Professor. Dr. Klein's sub-specialty in Maternal-Fetal Medicine served as the foundation for her works as the Director of the Maternal and Infant Care project located at the Grady Memorial Hospital, which continues

Throughout her 60-year career, Dr. Klein championed equality in health care for adolescent, low-income and incarcerated women of color, women with disabilities, women with HIV, and other underserved populations. She was noted for her teaching abilities and her excellent clinical judgment. Dr. Luella Klein has numerous other accolades including: she was the first female president of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and she was the 25th president of the







Dr. Lewis is a reproductive endocrinologist with Reproductive Biology Associates in Atlanta. She will bring attendees her lecture, "Preimplantation genetic testing for an uploidy (PGT-A): Is it needed for all patients pursuing IVF?" She will walk attendees through the fundamentals of PGT-A as well as discuss recent literature analyzing IVF

outcomes with PGT-A. Attendees will gain an understanding of "mosaic embryos" and how to interpret these results and will address prenatal testing recommendations for patients using PGT-A tested embryos.

Dr. Lewis has special interests in fertility preservation, patients with diminished ovarian reserve, recurrent pregnancy loss and implantation failure. Dr. Lewis decided to practice infertility medicine to be able to give patients the ability to conceive no matter what their circumstances.

Dr. Lewis has conducted research on societal views on fertility preservation. She has also investigated the impact of fibroids on fertility and the best methods for fibroid removal prior to fertility treatments. Other research interests include image analysis of embryos selected for implantation and the effect of obesity on in vitro fertilization (IVF) outcomes.

Dr. Lindsay is a Maternal Fetal Medicine provider in Atlanta, GA. Dr. Lindsay has decades of experience in and serves as the Division Director for Maternal Fetal Medicine at Emory University and Chief of Service

for Obstetrics at Grady Memorial Hospital. Dr. Lindsay led the development and implementation of maternal mortality review in Georgia more than ten years ago and continues to serve as the Lead for the Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC). Dr. Lindsay received his medical degree from Yale University School of Medicine. We are excited for Dr. Lindsay to bring us his lecture, "Reinstitution of maternal mortality review in Georgia lessons learned."

During his lecture, Dr. Lindsay will walk us through how we measure maternal mortality in the United States, the role of maternal mortality review committees, and how findings from the Georgia maternal mortality review committee can guide and direct statewide prevention efforts. With the recent extension of postpartum Medicaid from six months to one year, the efforts of the maternal mortality review committee are evident. This lecture is a do not miss.

Teresa Morneault, PT, DPT, WCS Clinical Session IV

Teresa Morneault, PT, DPT, WCS will bring to the GOGS audience a Physical Therapist's approach to pelvic floor therapy with her lecture, "Holistic Approach to Pelvic Health: A

Physical Therapist's Perspective." Her lecture, which will build upon the therapies described by Dr. Barabra Henley, will walk attendees through the anatomical, mechanical and psychosocial dysfunction affecting pelvic floor health. Attendees will gain a broad understanding for holistic pelvic assessment and treatment and become aware of tools and resources for self-management for transition to the community.

Teresa completed her Master's then Doctorate in Physical Therapy at Shenandoah University in Winchester, VA. She is certified in pelvic health, dry needling and Pilates with rehab emphasis. She treats all genders throughout the lifespan for orthopedic and/or pelvic dysfunction.

Santosh Patel, MD, MBA Clinical Session II

Santosh Patel, MD, MBA is an Addiction Psychiatrist at Emory University and the Medical Director of the Intensive Outpatient Program at the Addiction Alliance of Georgia. Dr. Patel completed his training in general

psychiatry at the Medical College of Georgia and his addiction psychiatry fellowship at Emory University. Dr. Patel also has additional certification in the specialty of sports psychiatry through the International Society of Sports Psychiatry. Dr. Patel's research is focused on the identification and prevention of substance use disorders in adults and the development of evidenced based treatment programs meant to improve patient engagement and prevent relapse.

His lecture "Opioid Withdrawal and Suboxone Induction During Pregnancy" will walk attendees through the Epidemiology of of opioid use during pregnancy. Highlights of the lecture will include identifying opioid use and assessing withdrawal and gestational complications of opioid withdrawal. Attendees will receive an overview of updated buprenorphine /naloxone prescriber guidelines, Buprenorphine/naloxone pharmacology, induction, and titration, and peripartum management.

Jessie Rubin, MD Clinical Session I

Dr. Rubin is board certified in both OB GYN and REI. She is passionate about helping individuals who need reproductive assistance. Her primary clinical interests

include fertility preservation, in vitro fertilization, polycystic ovarian syndrome, third party reproduction, and diminished ovarian reserve. Additionally, Dr. Rubin focuses on fertility preservation for women before and after cancer therapy. She is a passionate patient advocate who is dedicated to providing a high-quality, individualized approach to fertility medicine.

Dr. Rubin's lecture "REI in 2022: Celebrities, Netflix, and Roe" will discuss the impact of advanced reproductive age on fertility success. Dr. Rubin will demystify concerns about lab safety in reproduction and investigate how politics may impact reproductive care.

Neel Shah, MD, MPP, FACOG Clinical Session II

Neel Shah, MD, MPP, FACOG may be a familiar face to those physicians who attended the 2021 Georgia Perinatal Quality Collaborative annual meeting. Dr. Shah is Chief Medical Officer of Maven Clinic, the largest virtual clinic for women's and family health, and Assistant Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology and

Reproductive Biology at Harvard Medical School. Prior to joining the Harvard faculty, Dr. Shah founded Costs of Care, an NGO that curates insights from clinicians and patients to help delivery systems provide better care. In 2017, he co-founded the March for Moms Association, a coalition of more than 20 leading organizations, to increase public and private investment in the wellbeing of mothers. Dr. Shah serves on the advisory boards of the National Institutes of Health, Office of Women's Health Research, and as special advisor on public health innovation to the state of Oklahoma.

Dr. Shah's lecture, "Building Trustworthy Systems for Childbirth" will guide attendees on how to understand the role of design in developing equitable systems of care. Dr. Shah will identify how to evaluate opportunities to address communication failures in providing care and attendees will analyze the role digital technology plays in improving access and reliability of care.




